# Flushing Village Regatta - Saturday 23rd July 2022

## **Notice of Race**

## **1. ORGANISING AUTHORITY.**

a. The organising authority is Flushing Sailing Club.

## 2. RULES

- 2.1 Racing will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 2.2 The following Rules are changed:

a. RRS 29.2-Classes recalled will be restarted after the last scheduled start of other classes. b.

RRS 44.1 and 44.2 are subject to change.

2.3 IRC 2014 Rules Parts A, B & C. Amendment to IRC Rule 22.4.2 to change to IRC Certificate crew number + 1.

2.4 Nothing written either in this Notice of Race or the Event Sailing Instructions removes a boat's responsibility to comply with the Falmouth Harbour bye-laws, see: www.falmouthport.co.uk/pdf/bye-laws.pdf

## **3. ELIGIBILTY AND ENTRY**

- a. The Regatta is open to all boats of the classes listed below.
- b. Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form and sending it to the Race Committee, with the entry fee.
- c. Entries can be made on the water by giving completed entry forms to the late entry boats.
- d. Entrants under 16 years of age shall provide written permission from parent/guardian and completed and signed the parental permission form provided.
- e. If 6 or more boats of a class, not listed below, enter a separate class start may be provided at the discretion of the Race Committee

#### 4. ENTRY FEES

- a. The entry fee is £5.00
- b. For Under 16's, the entry fee is free.

#### 5. HANDICAPPING

Handicapping for the South West Yacht Time Correction Class (YTC) will be at the discretion of the Race Committee. Yachts racing under IRC may be required to provide copies of their IRC certificates. Yachts racing in Class Q or U must indicate on the entry form which handicap system they will be racing under as they will be scored separately.

Class flags must be flown from the backstay or mainsail leech of all boats with the exception of Sunbeams, Ajaxes, Open day boats, Flying Fifteens, SMODS & dinghies.

## 7. Prizes

- 8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS will be available on line at <u>www.pofsa.co.uk</u> and www.flushingsailingclub.co.uk together with this NOR and entry forms. These documents will also be available on the day at Flushing Sailing Club and from late entry boats.
- 9. COURSE AREA will be in the Falmouth/St Mawes Harbour, Carrick Roads and Falmouth Bay
- 10. COURSES to be sailed will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

**11. VHF BROADCASTS** – the Race Committee will broadcast race information on Channel 72.

## **12. RISK STATEMENT**

a. Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone".

b. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- i. They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- ii. They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their property whether afloat or ashore;
- iii. They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own action or omission;
- iv. iv. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- v. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- vi. The provision of safety boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- vii. They are responsible for ensuring that their boat is equipped and seaworthy so as to be able to face the extremes of weather;
- viii. viii. That there is a crew sufficient in number, experience and fitness to withstand such weather; and
- ix. That the safety equipment is properly maintained, stowed and is in date and is familiar to them.

## **13. SAFETY REQUIREMENTS**

13.1 Competitors in dinghy classes and all competitors under the age of 18 shall wear

approved personal flotation devices whilst afloat. Wet or dry suits are not adequate buoyancy. For all other boats it is the skipper's responsibility to ensure that their boat carries sufficient life jackets for all its crew. It is also the skipper's responsibility to ensure that all persons on board wear life jackets when appropriate and must wear them when Flag Y is shown from the Club-house or the Committee Boat.

13.2 Below is a list of safety equipment to which all competing boats (excluding dinghies and open day boats) must comply. Each item of Equipment shall function properly and be suitable for its intended purpose in the size of boat on which it is carried. Each item shall be securely stowed and ready for immediate use. Any additional equipment required by class rules must also be carried.

- 1. Suitable anchor
- 2. Fire extinguisher if fuel or gas carried
- 3. Horseshoe type lifebuoy or life sling
- 4. Oar and Rowlock if item 15 not carried
- 5. Bucket and lanyard
- 6. Gas inflated EN 150 Newton lifejacket for each crew 15. Auxiliary Engine
- 7. Marine compass and chart of area to be sailed
- 8. VHF radio with suitable marine Channels

- 10. Powerful torch /spare batteries
- 11. Two red flares (or LED/Laser equivalent)
- 12. Two orange smoke flares (or LED/Laser equivalent)
- 13. Whistle and Fog Horn
- 14. Bilge Pump
- 16. First Aid Kit
- 17. Heaving line/throw bag with 15m of floating line ready and accessible from the cockpit

9. Depth sounding equipment **14. RADIO COMMUNICATION** 

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction applies to mobile phones.

## **15. INSURANCE**

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 at all times and shall continue to do so while engaged in racing under this NOR.

#### **16. RACE COMMITTEE**

The Race Committee members will be the Race Officer, FSC Vice Commodore and the Secretary of Flushing Village Sailing Regatta.
